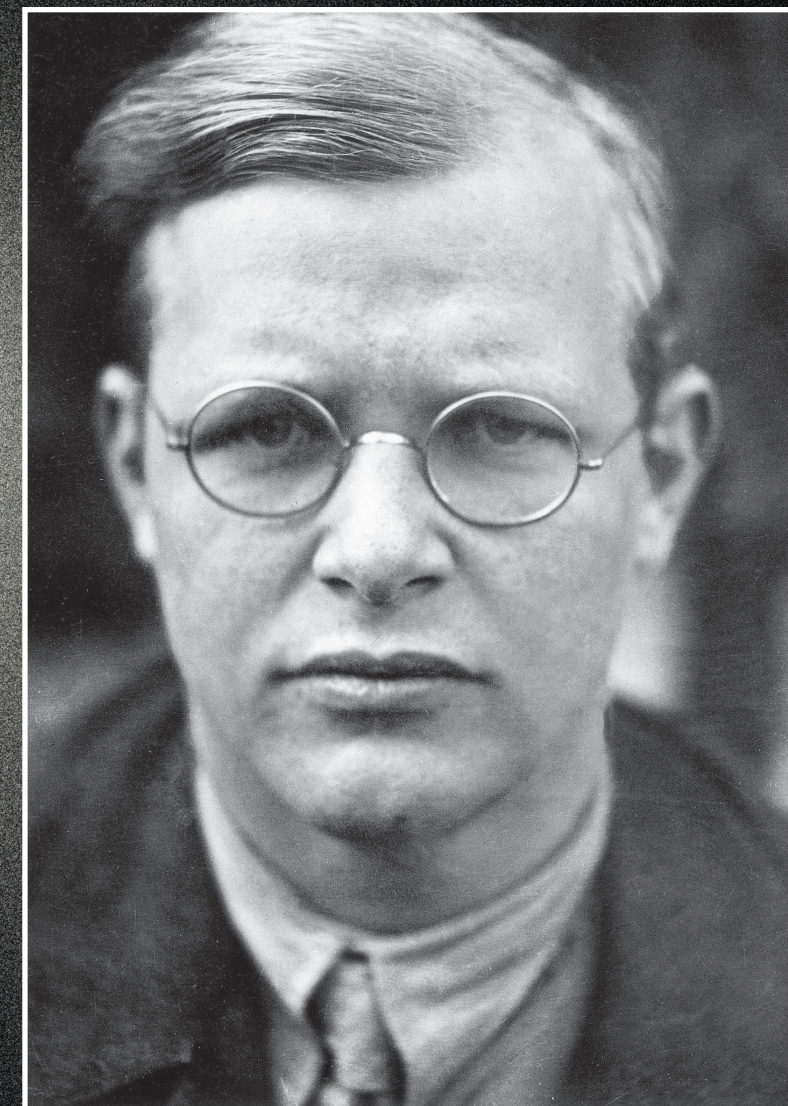

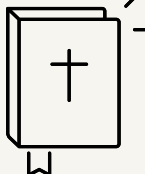

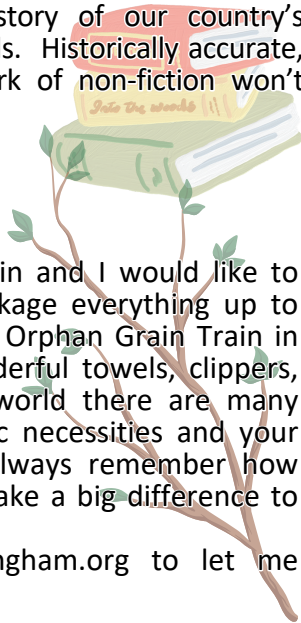


CHICKS WITH STICKS

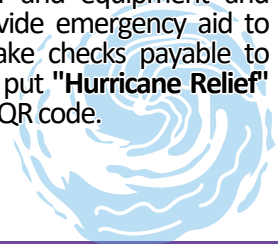
