STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

"Repenting of Yours and Mine"

Retailers have had their Christmas displays up since before Reformation Sunday. The kids have made their list and checked it twice, or three times or more. It won't be long before the tree will start shedding its needles, the stockings emptied, the gifts unwrapped, toys broken, and the too small or out of style clothes returned. Before we know it, the annual celebration of Christmas will be over.

But for the children of God, we know that the gift of Christmas doesn't ever end. Week in and week out, the Lord continues to shower His gifts on us. Every time the Lord gathers us to His house, and we are led to kneel at His table, the gift of forgiveness is repeatedly granted to us. It is nothing we deserve. It comes to us freely!

The fourth stanza of the stewardship hymn, "Forgive Us Lord for Shallow Thankfulness" (LSB 788) highlights both this gift and our response.

Teach us, O Lord, true thankfulness divine, that gives as Christ gave, never counting cost

To learn thankfulness is necessary. The parents of young children are well-versed in the fact that they must teach their children thankfulness. It does not come naturally. The spiritual genetics inherited from our parents allow us to think that the world revolves around us. When we receive something, there is an inward desire to think that we in some way deserve it.

But there is no way that we deserve anything we get from our Lord. We need that ongoing lesson from God Himself. Thankfulness toward God is worked in us by the Holy Spirit. God's Word works this thanksgiving in us. We need this weekly reminder that Jesus didn't consider "equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself" for us, to the point of death on a cross (Phil. 2:6). He didn't bat an eye. He paid the price! Our life of stewardship is one of daily and weekly thanksgiving inspired by the Lord Himself.

That knows no barrier of "yours" and "mine," assured that only what's withheld is lost.

Because Jesus gave us everything and more, there can be no ownership. The child at Christmas is quick to claim that the newly gifted toy is "mine!" But as Psalm 24:1 asserts, "The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein." There isn't anything in creation that is ours. When we cling to and claim ownership of anything in creation, we are losing

out on the continual gifts with which the Lord desires to shower upon us. Closed hands cannot receive anything new. We cling to the old and dead and miss the new thing that the Lord desires to do in and for us.

We are led to repent of the "yours" and "mine" and remove the lie that we have any ownership. In this we have the promise that God will continue to give to us. Not just at Christmas, but every Sunday at the altar in the Lord's house.

The library has resources to help you and your family spend meaningful time together this Advent season to learn about Jesus and the true meaning of Christmas. They are too numerous to list here, so stop in and see the library displays!

NEW! The library now has a copy of the book referenced by Pastor Randy in his Veterans Day sermon! <u>Mission at Nuremberg</u> by Tim Townsend tells the story of LCMS Pastor Henry Gerecke who served as U.S. Army Chaplain ministering to the Nazi war criminals inside the Nuremberg Palace of Justice in 1945-1946 from the trial's beginning through their execution. This is a story of a humble, yet very strong man of God who saw, even in men who did vile things, human beings made in the image of God who needed the Gospel of Jesus Christ.



FIRST CHRISTMAS TREE IN A CHURCH!

Back in 1851, Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church in Cleveland, OH became the first church in the United States to place a Christmas tree in the sanctuary. Reverend Henry Schwan began his tenure that year and, being of German descent, was used to a Christmas tree in his home and placed one in the church. It was decorated with candies, cookies, candles, and a beautiful star from Germany. He thought nothing of this but some folks were not happy, and word got out around town. "They are worshiping a shrub" at Zion! Reverend Schwan began to do research and found that in other Christian countries it was not uncommon to place at Christmas tree in sanctuary. So he did it again the next Christmas. The controversy died down, other churches put up trees, and Reverend Schwan would remain the pastor for 30 years.



FUN FACT: Zion Lutheran Church is the same church where Pastor Randy was baptized!





100TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION



Advent, the special weeks of preparation before Christmas, is a magical time of anticipation and excitement at Redeemer. The Birth of our Savior is highlighted with activities, spiritual reflection, and joyous celebrations. Right after Thanksgiving, the decorating begins. For decades, a joyous group has gathered to put up the 15-foot trees, wreaths, and garland in the Sanctuary. All the hallways and the Town Square are gleaming with the warm colors of red and green. The Chapel is also decorated with trees on which hang Chrismons. This twenty-year-old ministry was started by Corinne Chesna, who began creating delicate, white needlepoint ornaments honoring the memory of loved ones in the congregation who have passed.

It has been a long-standing tradition at Redeemer to have families come forward and light the candles on the Advent Wreath. Families volunteer to light the purple and pink candles, which are called the Bethlehem candle, the Shepherd's candle, the Angel candle, and the King's candle.

Choirs rehearse for months to present familiar Advent hymns and symphonic scales, such as the Christmas portion of The Messiah, and the popular "Lessons and Carols." Another highly anticipated event, the annual Christmas Pageant, features Sunday School children who rehearse weekly till the big performance, attracting excited parents, adoring grandparents, family members, and friends.





In the 1960's and 1970's, Redeemer women held a Christmas musicale and Silver Tea. The Birmingham Eccentric newspaper annually featured the event inviting ladies from the area to attend. Myrtle Wuggazer played the piano, Nancy Kochenderfer the organ, and our choir soloist provided the vocal compliment.

In preparation for Advent, one of the most popular events is "Advent By Candlelight," which welcomes over 450 members and guests annually. Redeemer women invite seven guests to join them for appetizers and desserts at beautifully decorated tables. From there, they are united in the Sanctuary for a lovely evening of singing, personal reflections, and worship as they prepare for the season and the coming birth of our Savior. The first Advent by Candlelight was an intimate affair in 1983 with a handful of

women attending the event directed by Marge Noettl. As you can see in the picture, Marge would decorate the room with Leslie Whitfield's grandmother's beautiful quilts. The time and talent of Redeemer members is amazing, as is the growth of this special event over the years!

To encourage creativity, Redeemer sponsors a Christmas Card Contest for the children of the congregation. From preschool age to 5th grade, each child can exercise their talents with a drawing featuring the story of Jesus' birth. Based on creativity, presentation, and theme, a winner is chosen, and their masterpiece is showcased on Redeemer's Christmas Card, which is sent out to every member of the church. Every child who submits a design receives a small prize, too.

Since 1985, our generosity of spirit has shone in programs like the "Angel Tree." Located in the Town Square area, the tree displays "Angel" tags bearing Christmas "Wish Lists" for the



congregation. The lists first came from Oakland Community Services in Ferndale, a connection made from a beloved member and Ferndale City Manager, Jess Soltess, who now celebrates the Advent season with Jesus. More recently, the tags are from Grace Centers of Hope in Pontiac. The children's "In-Gathering of Toys" from our Sunday School children supports several local agencies. In the 1990's, Redeemer sponsored an Alternative Gift Market. Gifts such as cows, sheep, and chickens could be purchased for the needy in other countries. In 1996, over \$6,000 in international gifts had been provided.

100TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

In 2018, church volunteers went to Camp Restore in Detroit and helped the children there with drawing and coloring Christmas pictures and cards while creating a lively party atmosphere. Camp Restore is one of Redeemer's major community restoration projects, building and restoring homes and neighborhoods in the North East Corridor.

In the years of the COVID pandemic, a "Live Nativity" was one of Redeemer's most creative events. Held outside on the church grounds, our members reenacted Biblical scenes for the congregation as they walked the grounds. Luckily, there was a real fire pit to warm the crowd as the temperatures dropped, giving an ode to the first chilly Christmas Eve.





Redeemer also provides a "light" for the community with our Nativity scene on the front lawn, the luminaries on the circle drive, and co-sponsoring the Nativity scene in Birmingham's Shain Park with Our Shepherd Lutheran Church and Ascension of Christ Lutheran Church since 2006.

Redeemer's gift of spreading the joy of the Advent season has lasted throughout the decades, leaving a mark in the community. Each year, a member donates buttons for the congregation to wear when they are out and about. The buttons proclaim the love of Jesus and the reason for the Christmas season!

WHAT BROUGHT YOU TO REDEEMER?

I first came to Redeemer as David Mammel's girlfriend in 1986. As a lifelong member of Redeemer, David told me countless stories of his growing up in the church. Redeemer didn't disappoint. Meeting Pastor Duane for the first time was the best introduction I could have asked for. Not only was he kind and friendly, but he took the time to tell me about the service and communion and genuinely welcomed me. Because I wasn't Lutheran at the time, I remember being particularly pleased there was an outline that I could fill in during Pastor Duane's sermons! As the years went on, David and I were married in 1992 and our kids baptized in 1997 and 2000.I volunteered my time in Sunday School, Summer Kamp, VBS, and Altar Guild. Those initial feelings back in 1986 of warmth and love have not faded!

I recently watched the Netflix documentary called "Martha" (Stewart). It left me feeling incredibly sad. Such a tragedy. This highly successful and driven women had amassed a multi-billion-dollar fortune and really had little to no relationships intact (that were not on her payroll at least).

She is the truism personified, "it's lonely at the top." Martha's father held her to an extremely high standard in the home growing-up, and he was punitive if the performance he expected was not attained. According to this movie, Martha divorced after 30 years, and it is reported that her husband felt he could never really do anything right. She picked at him constantly. He reportedly had many affairs and finally filed for divorce. She required unrealistic perfection from everyone in her life - from employees to friends to family.

Sadly, at the end of the interview, she finally admitted that "imperfection is not so bad after all." I actually think there is beauty in imperfection and beauty in ALL of us. We ALL are not perfect and never will be until the "Day of Christ" (Philippians 1:6)

- 3. RELAX and be mindful every morning of the real Reason for the season Jesus. Please try to say The Lord's Prayer before you get out of bed. God does not want you to be stressed, but instead, focus on Him. Do not let the evil one use stuff and busyness to distract you from honoring Jesus on His Birthday.
- 4. When you are tempted to be critical (of others OR yourself), immediately REVERSE and turn it into a complement. Watch their face.






