Give 'em Watts, Boys!


Rev. James Caldwell was sympathetic to the rebels/patriots, his home and church were burned to the ground by Loyalists in 1780.



When Caldwell was with the Continental Army at Morristown, the British, Hessian and Loyalists moved through the area where Mrs. Caldwell lived with their 9 Parta Respondent children and was shot in her home and killed.

After a short time after her death, the British engaged the Continental Army at the Battle of Springfield. During the fight, the Continentals ran low on the paper wadding that was used to pack the powder and ball in the musket.

At this time the hymnal being used in most churches (Presbyterian and Congregational) was a hymnal containing psalms and hymns, written and assembled by Rev. Isaac Watts. The writer of many great hymns including When I Survey the Wondrous Cross, Joy to the World, Our God, Our Help in Ages Past, just to name a few.



Reverend Caldwell, in seeing the need for paper to pack the muskets, ran into a church and grabbed Watts' hymnals and brought them to the regiment and shouted, "Give them Watt's boys, give them Watt's", the soldiers tore out the pages to make the much-needed wadding.

The battle of Springfield was the last major engagement in the northern colonies, and it was a Continental victory!

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

THE REWARDS OF GODLINESS

It's no secret that you can't bribe your way into heaven. No amount of good works will impress God enough to open heaven's door for their sake. "For the wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23) and the person who "keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it" (James 2:10). Rather, salvation is "the free gift of God ... in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 6:23).

So, your good works won't earn you the reward of heaven. But does that mean that there are no rewards at all? Consider what the Small Catechism says in the "Close of the Commandments":

What does God say about all these commandments?

He says, "I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments." (Ex. 20:5–6)

What does this mean?

God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands. (SC II)

God promises to bless you in keeping His commandments. What might these blessings be? Well, consider what Paul says about keeping the Fourth Commandment: "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 'Honor your father and mother' (this is the first commandment with a promise), 'that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land'" (Eph. 6:1–3).

And think about what your life would be like if you went around stealing (breaking the Seventh Commandment), telling lies about people (breaking

the Eighth Commandment), and generally being cruel to those around you (breaking all the commandments!). That is obviously not a blessed way to live. In fact, you'd be miserable living that way.

And Jesus says more about what is in store for those who make sacrifices for His sake: "Jesus said to them, 'Truly, I say to you, in the new world, when the Son of Man will sit on His glorious throne, you who have followed Me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands, for My name's sake, will receive a hundredfold and will inherit eternal life'" (Matt. 19:28–29).

So don't grow impatient in doing good. Follow the Lord who has freely given you everlasting life.








Women's Book Group

Laura, Nicole, and Gia have been members since they were kids and now lead our Family Life Ministry, Children's Ministry, and Senior High Youth Group. Steve has


been our Music Minister since 2009. Redeemer is blessed to have so many long-time staff members, and you will learn more about them in 2025!



Teaser and Trivia for our Staff and Worship Ministry


Our office staff has had a weekly volunteer for over 40 years. She started helping out when her daughter started preschool at Westmaple. Any ideas?

When I was younger I would eagerly await the 4th of July fireworks. Now, as years have gone by, I find that I don't have the same excitement as I did previously, to watch them light up the sky. My dogs go into paranoid mode finding a place of refuge when the firecrackers begin. All of the sky noise that is relative to the 4th is actually deleterious to our dog's emotional state of security, safety and comfort.

I think children feel the same emotions of insecurity, danger and discomfort when they are witness to "fireworks" in the marriage. Most of us begin our marriages with "white lace and promises and a kiss for luck and we are on our way" (Karen Carpenter). As time evolves throughout the marriage there can be changes in career, health, finances or responsibilities and ultimately our emotional needs and objectives can be challenged. We lose our perspective.

There are a few things that can be immediately implemented to help the children feel more secure and settle down (if they are acting out in misbehavior).

- 1. Parents do NOT disagree with your spouse's parenting style or discipline modality in front of the children. You will undermine their authority in front of the kids. Which will add to more confusion and bad behavior increase. It is my belief that this can slowly damage a marriage. Remember, your spouse comes FIRST NOT your kids. If the marriage breaks what do they have then? By all means, please discuss and come to agreement whatever concerns you have with each other in private...outside, in the car, or when kids are asleep in bed.
- 2. Always present a united front when dealing with the kids in any way.
- 3. Affirm that you love them continually bending down and making eye and physical contact with the child.
- 4. Remember that YOU are the parent and giving the child too much leeway in making decisions for themselves can be unfruitful and deleterious to the family order and, their (age appropriate)maturation development process. They will test the fence line. No doubt. Make sure it is ALWAYS on!! Meaning, be consistent with boundaries and violation of consequences thereof.
- 5. The Titus2gether group discuss the bullet points of "Have a New Husband by Friday" by Kevin Lehman. I must tell you I think a lot of us got rebooted in our thinking about the nature of our relationship and expectations we have with our husbands. Too much "Girl-friending" of our husbands was happening and then when they don't perform


