Touchstone magazine published an article by Robbie Lowe entitled "The Truth About Church and Men" showing a link between fatherhood and grace. Lowe examined data from a national

survey examining if a persons religion would be taken to the next generation. If so why, if not why? The survey data indicated the following:

• If the father doesn't attend church and the mother attends regularly, only 2% of the children attended regularly while 37% attended irregularly and over 60% didn't attend church at all.

Now this data is striking:

• If the father did not attend church regularly, one in five children were regular church attendees, even if the mother attended.

Moreover...

• If the father attended regularly, regardless of what the mother does, two-thirds to three-fourths of the children became churchgoers, either regular or irregular.

And even...

• If the father is an irregular churchgoer, between half and two-thirds of the children in this survey attended church regularly or irregularly. Fascinating findings. Fathers play a very important spiritual role in shaping the faith of their child, or children. Dads don't underestimate the example you give to your young just by sitting in a pew.



Community Strength:

A heartfelt thank you to the 24 incredible women who joined us for an evening of empowerment and collaboration. Your presence made the event a success.

Empowering Women Globally:

Through your contributions, we were able to grant \$7,145 in loans and grants to a total of 15 women. This brings our chapter total to an outstanding \$80,377, impacting the lives of 231 women. Your generosity is creating a ripple of positive change. Once loans are repaid, a new woman is given a loan!

Inspiration from Jessica Cummings:

We were honored to have Jennifer Cummings, Managing Director at The Mandate and Executive Director at Surfari Pals Inc. as our keynote speaker. Jennifer, with her southern charm, shared stories of the people of Uganda and all that the Mandate is doing to pour into the people. Their efforts to invest in the local people and give them the opportunity to lift themselves and their community up aligned so perfectly with our mission. Jennifer discussed the 5 areas of impact The Mandate focuses on:

Education

Child sponsorship, University and Trade Schooling

Salma – local girl who was put through university and is now back in the village and running the Widows & Orphans program

Takia – sister of Salma who was supported all the way through Trade School and came back and now runs the tailoring program at the Hope Job Center

Women's Health

Hope for Girls – providing necessary supplies for menstrual cycles to allow the girls to stay in school. Mama Kits – providing expectant mothers with clean/sterile supplies to birth a child as women are required to bring all supplies with them to birthing center

Widows & Orphans

Provide them with solar lights, charcoal stoves and food and supply assistance

Clean Water

13 bore holes (wells) have been created within 7 mile radius of the village. Kids now have water when at school and the community has access to clean water too.

Evangelism

Prison Ministry and Sunday School for kids

Chicken Give Back Program - Provide chickens to families – require that they hatch the first laying (have to teach them "chicken multiplication" and that they can't eat the chicken or eggs right away). They are required to give back 2 chicks to sustain the program. Then they are able to expand the number of chickens they have to eat, or sell the excess chicks/eggs.

Women's Book Group

Women's Book Group invites you to review and appraise our June selection Killers of the Flower Moon: The Osage Murders and the Birth of the FBI by David Graan. In the 1920s, the richest people per capita in the world were members of the Osage Nation in Oklahoma. After oil was discovered beneath their land, the Osage rode in chauffeured automobiles, built mansions, and sent their children to study in Europe. Then, one by one these innocent people were disappearing or dying mysteriously and those who took notice disappeared as well. As the death toll rose, the newly created FBI took up the case, and the young director, J. Edgar Hoover, turned to a former Texas Ranger named Tom White to try to unravel the mystery. White put together an undercover team, including a Native American agent who infiltrated the region, and together with the Osage began to expose one of the most chilling conspiracies in American history. If the Osage story were never chronicled you would never believe this kind of thing could happen. Grann's writing is expository, compassionate and you will walk away praying this story is never repeated anywhere. Tuesday, June 25 at 7:00 in Redeemer's Town Square. (Summer reads for July and August: Remarkably Bright Creatures by Shelby VanPelt and When Crickets Cry by Charles Martin.)

This month we'll take a look back at the Pastoral Ministry at Redeemer

Upon his retirement in 2000, Rev. Duane Wuggazer remarked, "I have to tell you that what meant the most to me was the thoughtful way in which my dad's ministry and mine were blended together. My Dad never had the opportunity of a retirement this side of heaven, so now after all these years, his ministry of founding the congregation and mine of inheriting and maintaining and building upon that foundation is beautifully recognized and given equal prominence." The gift of the eternal light was given by the Board of Elders in recognition of that combined ministry, honoring their joint service of 69 years to Redeemer's congregation. That eternal light burns in our Sanctuary today.

Ours is such a blessed congregation. It is highly unusual that we have had only 3 senior pastors in the last 94 years. Three generations of Wuggazers ministered here, and 11 Sons of the Congregation were ordained. Our current Senior Pastor, Rev. Randall Schlak has been with us for over 25 years, and our Associate Pastor, Rev. James Greenwalt was raised here at Redeemer.




