"Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death." (2 Corinthians 7:10)



STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

Repenting of "Feasts that Know No Fast"

Fresh off the Christmas season and the retail frenzy that accompanies it, January brings a shot of frigid air into the lives of the people we know and love. This is not a meteorological statement either. While it is true that January is one of the colder months for those in North America, the cold front blast that hits us is the full force of credit card spending that fueled the retail frenzy. The bills for the gifts, the parties, the food and the travel have now come due. The credit card makes things convenient, but it also requires more discipline than many can muster. When the bills come in January for December's celebration, it really puts a damper on things.

Congregations often make the same mistake in stewardship. We often charge forward in doing what we always do or starting new endeavors without counting the cost. But at the end of the month, or the end of year, when the bill comes due, the red ink on the congregational balance sheet smacks the people in the face like a stiff north wind in January. We hunkered down. We circle the wagons. We start to panic. The work of the Gospel suffers.

The fifth verse of "Forgive Us, Lord, for Shallow Thankfulness" (LSB 788) addresses this January situation. The words penned by William Watkins Reid are very needful for us to hear as we start a new year, while dealing with the bills of past efforts and expense.

"Forgive us, Lord for feast that knows not fast..." This hits us hard, doesn't it? We love when the money is flowing, the parties are going, and things are getting bigger and better. But there is a time in life, and most especially in our spiritual disciplines, that we need to fast. The purpose of a fast is to step back, lay something aside for a time, and replace it with meditation on Scripture and prayer. This is designed to keep us from turning something that may well be good into an idol that separates us from the God who loves us in Christ.

"For joy in things that meanwhile starve the soul..." In "The Parable of the Sower," we hear Jesus talk about how the worries and cares of life choke out the growth of the seed of the Word that was planted. We know how this happens in our lives. Professional and youth sports do this. Materialism does this. Travel and leisure and do this. There is a list of things that we enjoy that starve the soul.

But it also happens in our congregations. When corporate stewardship is not managed in a responsible way, it can and does destroy individual stewardship. Is it good individual stewardship to support a ministry that doesn't take its corporate responsibility seriously?

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

"For walls and wars that hide your mercies vast and blur our vision of the Kingdom goal." This is the ultimate end of the idolatry of failed stewardship. We build walls between believers within the church and hamper those who are outside from coming to the Light of Life that is Jesus. The wars we fight over money and its impact on ministry do the same. It eventually blurs our vision of what we are here to do: share the Good News of Jesus. When the wintry blast of January hits us in this fashion, we are called to repent.

When the Holy Spirit uses the cold front of the call to repentance, we meet the God who forgives and restores. That is what He does for individual and corporate stewards. When the bills hit, they call us back to Jesus. He is the One who indeed forgives us our shallow thankfulness and leads us into the bounty of His mercy yet again.



NEW ARRIVALS AT THE REDEEMER LIBRARY!





100TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION



"But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord" (Joshua 24:15)

If you look around the Sanctuary on a Sunday morning, you will see a host of families that are heeding these words of Joshua. Seniors, parents, teens involved in youth group, couples, and singles living their family traditions through the auspices of Redeemer. Family life is a priority, and an aspect significant to Redeemer which has attracted our members and kept them faithful to our church over the years.

During the 1960s and 1970s, Redeemer's Men's Club held annual Father-Son Banquets. Each event had a different theme, such as "Dads & Lads," "Man's Quest for Space," and several sports-related events. "Man's Quest for Space" in the '60s celebrated America's "Project Apollo" space program and moon landing with a pretend spaceship constructed by fathers and sons, space-related movies, and documentaries. A very special sports banquet in 1976 featured Lion's star punter Herman Weaver, nicknamed "Thunderfoot," who came to motivationally speak and entertain the "guys," big and little in the congregation.

In the late 60s and early 70s, Redeemer held family caroling festivals. Families would gather on a frosty night to sing carols for neighboring communities and celebrate afterward with hot cocoa and Christmas cookies.

For decades, girls have enjoyed a sweet night with their dads at the annual Daddy-Daughter Dance. And boys loved competing with their moms during mother-and-son bowling tournaments. There was never a lack of opportunities for family fun and playful entertainment. Ice cream socials, a 200-mile family bike hike, trips to nearby Metropolitan Beach, and Jelly Stone Family Campgrounds are just a few.

In the 1970s, a class called Parent Effectiveness Training (P.E.T.) was offered. This intensive and vital study taught parents how to communicate with their children at various stages in their lives. Another class that was invaluable in 1974 was entitled "Two Shall Become One." This unique workshop gave guidance to those seeking the marriage union, but also served as a refresher course on the practical realities of a Christian marriage.

In 1978, Redeemer's Director of Christian Education, Bill Meinert started the Family Life program, "Forum on Christian Living." This six-week program included studies for parents of confirmands, elementary students, and preschoolers. In 1984, in addition to his other duties, Bill Meinert was named the Minister of Family Life. One of his most successful programs was "Christmas ADVENTure."

This joyous event featured food, crafts, and Christmas fun. After Bill retired, Dottie Reiher came on board in 1987. One of her programs, the "Little Lambs Families," was a group for families with children 3 years and younger and it enabled these families to come together and socialize and "talk babies" with other couples in the same situation. Each month was organized around an activity that included the babies and toddlers. A program that exceeded expectations was P.A.R.T.N.E.R.S. or "Parents as Religious Teachers Need Encouragement, Resources, and Support." Each event included a meal, a family craft, songs, and a devotion.

In 1991, Joe Werner came to Redeemer, taking on the role of Minister of Children and Family Life. He introduced outings and retreats for families to Frankenmuth and the Wheels Inn, Ontario. Tons of fun and family bonding were the themes of these retreats. For many years, families camped together at Yogi Bear's Jellystone Park in Grayling. Due to Joe's efforts, Redeemer was awarded as a "Family Friendly Congregation" by the Lutheran Family Association in 1994!

Joe also started "Rainbows," a support group for single-parent children. They met for two six-week semesters, focusing on topics such as Self, Trust, Anger, Family, and God.

In 1996, the popular "Growing Kids God's Way" was introduced to Redeemer. Joe and Audrey Werner led this program that was based on helping parents learn about raising their children in a God-centered environment. Today, our "Positive Parenting" group helps young moms find support and fellowship with classes focusing on parenting skills. Moms can share their experiences with other moms and learn new parenting methods combined with tried and true techniques.

In 2000, Gary Priskorn took over the title of Minister of Discipleship from Cary Richert, who went on to Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana. In 2002, Gary became Minister of Family Life. The Family Life retreat called "Growing Fantastic Families" was a well-attended event in the early 2000s. Around the same time, Kitty Sweitzer, Director of Children's Ministries, and

a Westmaple Preschool teacher presented "Toys, Joys, and a Baby Boy," a combined effort featuring the children's Christmas pageant along with the "Ingathering of Toys" for local community service agencies. Both the Pageant and the Ingathering of Toys remain active service and children's worship projects today.

Redeemer has often sponsored evening activities for families. "Family Fun Fests" were a big hit when families enjoyed a night "in" Hawaii (2003) and "at" the OK Corral (2004). The church was transformed into a true to life, thematic atmosphere reflecting each of these themes. Family Service Nights were a combined effort on the part of Gary Priskorn, Laura Vowell, and Kitty Sweitzer. Families would also put together care packages for the homebound, the poor, and needy. These wonderful events combined service ministry with fellowship.

Andrea (Hofley) Yuhn started up the Young Families Club in 2009. You will see additional photos of the cookie decorating event on our video in the Town Square.

In 2006, the first "Marriage Vow Renewal" for Redeemer couples was held. Renewal vows were individually sanctified at the Altar by Pastor Randy, and each couple was presented with a photo. After the proceedings, couples attended a dinner dance at a local hotel. It was a lovely, elegant evening for all who attended. Coming in February 2025, there will be another opportunity to renew your marriage vows, strengthening the marriage bond yet again.

Today, our Family Life Director, Laura Vowell, has followed her family tradition of serving the Lord. One of her favorite events is the annual "Shine the Light Night," which provides an alternative to trick-or-treating in a Christ-centered Halloween event.

COUNSELING CORNER

Mourning the departure of a loved one is highly subjective. There are no time limits set by the research pertaining to grief recovery. When people are told, "It's time to get over it and move on..." by friends and family, it often has a deleterious effect on the one trying to adjust to their deeply personal loss.

For those of you who have not yet attended Redeemer's Pathways Grief and Loss Group meetings, here are a few tips to help start you on your journey to recovery from your loved ones passing:

- Try to get outside in the fresh air and sunlight, if possible, and take a walk daily. If you feel like crying, then
 do it lean into the tears. Your body wants to release the pain of this loss, and research shows that the
 chemistry of grief tears is toxic. So, when you feel the urge to cry...cry. Get that expression of grief and
 toxicity out of your body. Crying gives relief once you allow that release. FYI, chemically, tears of joy are
 not toxic.
- Write a letter (or several, until you no longer feel the need to do so) to your departed, and ask God to give it to them. He sees it, and loves you beyond your comprehension. He knows your pain right down to the cellular level, so trust Him in this process. Sometimes, a component of grief is unfinished business. Writing out your thoughts to this person or a situation helps give closure. One person in our Pathways Group reported that, after they had written their departed loved one a letter, they felt a measure of instant relief. Research has shown that writing out one's thoughts or journaling is also very healing and very good for one's mental and physical health.
- Celebrate your loved one by giving financially or of your time to a charity they would embrace. With the season of Lent coming upon us, plant or put in a pot a bush or tree in remembrance and celebration of your loved one's life. Every time you look at that greenery, remember the significance of the resurrection of our dear Lord and, because of what that represents, we shall be reunited with our loved ones in heaven. Glory to God!
- Think about getting a dog. After the loss of my 16-year-old Chihuahua CocoNut, I rescued a 9-year-old Chihuahua whose love and affection has been well beyond my expectations. I personally have found that animals are miraculous in their healing powers when we are sad, grieving, or lonely. Having to take a dog for a walk and outside throughout the day helps get our thoughts off ourselves and onto something else like these fury love bugs! They are so comforting!

Finally, I would like to encourage those of you who have suffered a loss and have not attended our Pathways Group meetings to do so. It is amazing to sit back and not facilitate, and just watch how the people heal each other organically, by sharing tips and their own experience with each other. What a gift they are to each other! One member of the Pathways Group recently shared with me an article from The Wall Street Journal about grief. The author Elizabeth Bernstein wrote, "What helped me the most is the realization that grief is unexpressed love. Lying in bed one night, unable to sleep, I asked myself: If there was a magic pill that I could take that would erase my grief, would I take it? The answer came to me like a revelation. Heck no. Because to erase the grief would be to erase my ongoing love for my dad."

This is a new year, one that can be filled with new beginnings and fresh starts. Remember, YOU are in charge of the timing and healing behaviors as suggested. Most of all, I want to encourage you to lean into Jesus. Talk with Him throughout the day. Psalm 34:18 reads, "The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit." You are never alone. We are here for you, too.




