A BLAST FROM THE PAST!

"The season of Lent is annually observed by the Lutheran Church. In the Christian and Lutheran sense, Lent is that season of the church year which has been set apart for the special consideration of the sufferings and death of Jesus Christ for the sins of the world. It is the time in which the church calls her members to a heartfelt and earnest meditation upon the passion of our Lord in order that they may be weaned away from



the cares and pleasures and interests of the world, and be more thoroughly won for the Kingdom of God. Lenten time is repenting time, and is a constant reminder to us of the greatest tragedy of the ages. No sadder thing happened, nor will ever occur, than the crucifixion of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

The death of Christ is, however, the greatest blessing that has ever been bestowed upon fallen mankind. In that which transpired on Calvary's hill on that memorable Good Friday, about 1926 years ago, one can see both the depth of human sin, which demanded such a sacrifice for its expiation, and the height of divine love. For the suffering and death of Christ, having come about in accord with the eternal decree and foreknowledge of God, took place in order that all who believe might be saved. This purpose of Christ's atoning self-sacrifice is nowhere so beautifully stated as in John 3:16:

'For God so loved the world that He gave His only-begotten Son, that whosoever believeth on Him should not perish, but have eternal life.'

The season of Lent brings these overwhelming truths to our attention in a special way. And, truly, so tremendous a price as that paid by our Savior for our souls, deserves more than a passing consideration now and then. No one will permit Lent to go by unobserved, unless he be little concerned about his sins and their terrible consequence, unless he be totally bereft of all love towards the Savior.

Lent is a time when the repentant soul, like the Prodigal Son, arises and goes home to his Father and says, 'I have sinned,' and feels the joy of forgiveness in his embrace and kiss. It is a time for spiritual refreshment for honest souls seeking God. It is the reparation for the great Feast of Easter - the festival of victory over sin and death, and every one who keeps Lent well, can rejoice in the victories that have secured to him 'a risen life.'

Redeemer Ev. Lutheran Church, the first Lutheran church in Birmingham, was established as a Mission in November, 1924, and organized into a congregation in April, 1925. The present church building on Lincoln avenue was dedicated May 10, 1925. Since its beginning Redeemer Lutheran church has experienced a steady growth. The total number of members is approximately 150 souls. The prospects for continued development is promising."

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

God's Instruments, God's Stewards

For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them. (Ephesians 2:10)

Some pastors refer to these words as "the most forgotten words in the Scriptures." They are forgotten because they follow the familiar and critical words before it. The preceding two verses that overshadow Ephesians 2:10 are words of justification: "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast" (Ephesians 2:8-9). These are words preached regularly. They are assigned as confirmation verses. They carry with them the very heart of what it means to be a redeemed child of God!

Precisely because the previous verses are so central to salvation, they often overpower our practice of stewardship! We have been saved by grace. This is certain and sure because of Jesus. Works play no role in our salvation. No credit taking for us! Grace is freely given. Faith is miraculously created by the Spirit and joyously received. This truth is so wonderful and so encompassing that we often miss out on WHY we are redeemed.

The grace of God revealed in Jesus calls us to faith. But St. Paul doesn't stop with grace and faith. He continues to the logical conclusion. Just like the creation declares the handiwork of God, the redemption of sinners like you and me declares His greatest handiwork! Redeemed stewards are created to reflect the grace and mercy God showers on us to others.

As Lutherans, we understand that good works flow from faith in Jesus Christ. They are the fruit of the tree of salvation into which we have been grafted by grace. Sanctification and stewardship are both ongoing and active confessions of what the Lord has done in us. These works are not always spectacular. Many times, they are simply parents showing Jesus to their children. They are compassionate actions that live out the truth of the Gospel to co-workers and even complete strangers. While they can be grand endeavors, more likely they are simple, beautiful works which highlight what Jesus has done in us.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

These works aren't random either. They have been planned by God. God planned to use you as a faithful steward as you walk the road that leads you through your daily life. There are no chance encounters or coincidences. They have been planned by the Lord of the universe for the benefit of His creation. Good works are what point to God's greatest work: Jesus!

He calls you and me to walk in this faith, which flows from this grace, which has been poured out on us in Jesus. But even this is not to our credit. We are simply called to be faithful stewards of God's grace so that we may share it with those who need is as much as we do. God's Spirit carries us along in this. We are just the steward - the instrument in His hand to accomplish His plan and glorify Him!

WOMEN'S MINISTRY

OH THE THE PARTY OF THE PARTY O

Soon after Redeemer's founding in 1924, 16 women united as the 'Ladies Aid' to raise funds and support work being done on the chapel. In 1929, the group was renamed the 'Ladies Missionary Society' with the motto, "Work! Make money! Spend that money!"

In the early years, they hosted bake sales and bazaars; made quilts and jams; and sold "dolly duzit" kitchen sponges. Popular fundraisers included "sauerkraut and ham dinners," and a system in which families

"bought" a basket with a baked good, made a new goodie, then "re-sold" the basket, all to benefit missions. The Paper Committee sold 2,050 pounds of paper for \$6.15 (remember, it was the 1930s)!

Also that time, the women also created separate Mission Teams. The Ruth Guild sewed cancer pads; the Rachel-Mary Guild ran the Spring Salad Buffet and Fashion Show; the Elizabeth-Martha Guild organized a Christmas auction; and the Naomi Guild held fashion shows modeling "Davidson's of Birmingham" clothing. Each Guild also hosted a booth at the World's Fair of Missions held in 1963.

Rummage sales became vital fundraisers after the first 1930s sale netted \$78.15. Soon after, Redeemer was hosting biannual sales that filled the church (except the Sanctuary) – the church even rented space on 8 Mile for storage!Sales continued off and on over the years, and the 2003 sale helped to support major parking lot improvements. Today, many ladies volunteer for the youth rummage fundraiser, led by Michele Margosian.

Missions remained important during the war years and beyond. Ladies sent cookies to servicemen overseas, cleaned pews, decorated the church for Christmas, and collected coins in 'Mite Boxes' to support Michigan District Synod services. In 1967, the "Book Nook" opened where Carol Romeo sold Bibles, books, jewelry, and cards to benefit missions.

In 1977, women's mission work was renamed the "Women's Society," encompassing Altar Guild, Friendship Circle, Mission Circle, and the Needlework Guild, which cross-stitched confirmation verses, made new member welcome baskets, and clothing for various charities. Women also published their mission dollar allocation; for example, in 1980, they distributed \$22,800 to local, national, and international missions.

Despite their focus on service, the ladies have always enjoyed the good things in life! They published a church cookbook in the 1960s featuring member recipes and have repeated the tradition numerous times since then with a 100th Anniversary cookbook coming soon!

In time, Marge Noettl stepped in to lead Women's Ministry. Kitty Sweitzer recalls that Marge "was strong in faith, hardworking in service, and dedicated to Redeemer," and when she saw a need, she lived by the mantra, "If you see it, do it!" During this time, Women's Ministry broadened its offerings to include various fellowship, educational, spiritual, and cultural events, ranging from Bible studies to lectures. The ladies also embraced their fun

sides with events like the Mad Hatter Party, Spring Luncheon, and "Girl's Night Out" - where the men served the food!

The first Women's Retreat was held at Camp Skyline in 1981 with over 50 women learning how to become "spiritual butterflies," metamorphosing with the theme of "Lord, Change Me." Many retreats followed, each with its own unique spiritual significance and comic relief!

For years, Myrtle Wuggazer helped ladies welcome the start of Advent with 'The Christmas Musicale and Tea,' which included various musicians including organist Nancy Kochenderfer. In 1988, the celebration changed to Advent by Candlelight which was brought to Redeemer by Denise McNaughton. Marge Noettl took the reins and the event has become a seasonal favorite ever since.

During the 1990s, Redeemer women played on a ladies' softball team, often followed by a trip to Pasquales for pizza. Participants fondly remember putting a porta crib behind the backstop!

Today, Women's Ministry is overseen by Kitty Sweitzer; Kitty leads a weekly Bible study for the women of Redeemer, while Andrea Schlak and Rosemary Ging lead a Community Bible study. Other programs include retreats, book club led by Stacey Rolf, lectures, outings, cooking classes with Donna Hollis, and bunco nights. We also maintain our commitment to missions, as discussed in last month's Lamp, and we annually celebrate the spirit of service when the annual Woman of the Year is announced at Advent by Candlelight. The cumulative dedication of these women to Redeemer and the community is so inspiring!

MEN'S MINISTRY

The men of Redeemer have always found ways to come together in the name of Jesus and to build fellowship.

In the 1960s, Redeemer's Men's Club was very active, holding monthly events such as a 1966 Chuck Wagon Dinner featuring a speaker from the Ford Motor Company about the Ford Racing Program.

In 1968, Redeemer launched Men's Bible Breakfast, which is now our longest running men's activity. It began on a cold, February morning as a group of men paid \$1.00 for breakfast, cooked by a "group of obliging ladies." The group started out reading about one Bible chapter a week, and the study was led for many years by Bill Rolf. He formally passed the Bible to Gary Priskorn, who now leads in-depth studies of a few verses each week... And today's men also make their own breakfast!

During this time, Redeemer partnered with neighboring First Presbyterian and First United Methodist Churches in the Maple Road Men's Club, which included a rotating annual joint banquet.

In the 1970s, the men chose to focus more narrowly on four major annual events: the Maple Road Banquet, a Father/Son Banquet, a Spring Golf outing, and a June

Steak Roast. Redeemer also had a group called the "Redeemer Businessmen," which held weekly luncheons at local restaurants.

Over the years, the men have enjoyed a number of other fellowship and educational events including banquets, wine tastings, lectures, and retreats.

In 2002, Gary Priskorn became the first formal leader of the Men's Ministry. Since that time, he has devoted many early mornings and late evenings to this vital ministry. He is the hands, feet, wisdom, and effort behind all of Redeemer men's activities. He shared that one of his favorite events was a 2005 tour of the World War II submarine, the USS Silversides, where the men's group spent the night onboard!

Gary instituted the popular quarterly Saturday morning Fellowship Breakfasts, which present relevant and gifted speakers, such as the Detroit Lions' Lem Barney and the ever-popular Reverend Ron Farah.

One especially entertaining speaker was former Redeemer member, Lou Kasischke. In 2008, Lou joined the Men's Breakfast to share his story about averting tragedy when he turned back from attempting to climb the summit of Mount Everest in 1996. He heard a voice inside him that overrode his personal desires and brought him home safely. The book he later wrote about the experience, After the Wind, is deeply inspiring.

"Guys Night Out" social events have become a mainstay on the men's calendar, including the annual Men's BBQ, which started in 2002. For many years, Bill Rolf hosted the event and Tom Violante provided dinner. Those who wish to can also join a golf scramble beforehand, organized by "Golf Commissioner" Walt Sweitzer.

Redeemer men have a long sporting history, especially due to our "home plate" baseball diamond. In 1980, the team won the Division E Championship with a team led by the Helmke Brothers and "Home Run Walt" Sweitzer. In 1981, the men won the Division D Championship with a 19-2 record, with separate MVP awards for Walt Sweitzer and Cliff Clark. Other members of the winning team were Keith Lewis, Bruce Helmke, Jim Helmke, Tim Springer, and Mike Dundas.

Men's Ministry has hosted many other sports teams and events, including bowling leagues with team names like the 'Holy Rollers' and 'Sermon Sleepers.' In 2007, Redeemer introduced the "Man Olympics," and in 2008 launched an annual Bocce Ball Tournament hosted by Fred and Jeanne Hollis, culminating in the award of a very unique trophy. Today, our most popular sport is pick-up basketball, as men gather on Tuesday and Thursday nights at Redeemer for friendly competition.

Men's Ministry is dedicated to service and has had a special and lasting impact on building and construction projects. For decades, experts such as members Jim Endress and Cliff Clark have repaired, rebuilt, and provided other construction services for families in need through missions such as Camp Restore, Habitat for Humanity, and Christmas in Action.

The men of Redeemer have always found a way to be the hands and feet of Jesus. From community gatherings to sporting events, from Bible studies and mission work, they have spread their faith and enhanced men's fellowship in the church.

COUNSELING CORNER

Recently, I read about a research project conducted by the Center of Bible Engagement (CBE) where 40,000 people ages 8-80 were surveyed about their Bible reading habits. "As they compiled the results, they made a profound discovery they were not even looking for when they originally planned the survey."

They found that people who read their Bible one to two times a week had negligible change in their life. Three times a week people, might see a bit of an uptick. "Something moved in the behavior of the person engaging in Scripture." The eyeopener happened when Bible engagement reached at least four times a week. The astonishing findings included the following statistics:

- 1. Feeling lonely dropped 30%
- 2. Anger issues dropped 32%
- 3. Bitterness in relationships dropped 40%
- 4. Alcoholism dropped 57%
- 5. Sex outside of marriage dropped 68%
- 6. Feeling spiritually stagnant dropped 60%
- 7. Viewing pornography dropped 61%
- 8. Sharing your faith jumped 200%
- 9. Discipling others jumped 230%

I thought how timely to get into a new, positive habit for the New Year! I would like to invite all of you who are reading this article to start today by reading your Bible 4 times a week – or more! – and observe how your life changes!

You may start by reading a few verses a day and then contemplate them throughout the day. If you're not sure, ask the Lord where to begin. I personally love the Psalms and Proverbs.

May the Lord touch your soul during this Bible reading challenge!




