Happy Reformation! On October 27th, we shall once again celebrate the Reformation. It was on October 31, 1517 that Luther posted the 95 Theses on the church door in Wittenberg.

As we look ahead to celebrating Reformation Sunday, here are some Luther quotes that I thought you would enjoy...

"God writes the Gospel not in the Bible alone, but also on trees, and in the flowers and clouds and stars."



"Whoever drinks beer, he is quick to sleep; whoever sleeps long, does not sin; whoever does not sin, enters Heaven! Thus, let us drink beer!"

"You say, "What comes out of our mouth must be kept!" I hear it — which mouth do you mean? The one from which the farts come? (You can keep that yourself!)"

"I am of a different mind ten times in the course of a day. But I resist the devil, and often it is with a fart that I chase him away. When he tempts me with silly sins I say, "Devil, yesterday I broke wind too. Have you written it down on your list?"

"I remind myself of the forgiveness of sin and of Christ and I remind Satan of the abomination of the pope. This abomination is so great that I am of good cheer and rejoice, and I confess that the abomination of the papacy after the time of Christ is a great consolation in me."

"Let the wife make the husband glad to come home, and let him make her sorry to see him leave."

"So when the devil throws your sins in your face and declares that you deserve death and hell, tell him this: "I admit that I deserve death and hell, what of it? For I know One who suffered and made satisfaction on my behalf. His name is Jesus Christ, Son of God, and where He is there I shall be also!"

"And yet here in Wittenberg we have the pick on the crown. Bread from the last supper, milk from the virgins breast, a thorn that pierced Christ's brow on Calvary and nineteen thousand other bits of sacred bone."

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT



Lutherans have historically been called "the singing church." There is no doubt that music has been a major component in the theology and practice of the Lutheran church. Luther once remarked about music, "We can mention only one point, namely, that next to the Word of God, music deserves the highest praise." Music has a power and purpose that cannot be understated in our worship and the life of the congregation.

But music does more than touch the emotions. Music is a vehicle that carries both the musician and the hearer deeper into connection with the truth of the Scriptures. This is true of the most complex Bach chorale and even the simplest of songs like "Jesus Loves Me, This I Know." Each musical selection within the church shapes the thoughts, minds and faith of the people who experience them.

This is also true of stewardship hymns. We are currently considering the verses of "Forgive Us, Lord, for Shallow Thankfulness" (LSB 788) as it shapes our understanding and practice of stewardship. This month we take a deeper dive into verse two:

Teach us to thank you, Lord, for love and grace For life and vision, for a purpose clear, For Christ Your Son, and for each human face that shows Your message ever new and near.


The stanza begins by touching on the truth of the Law. Thankfulness is not a natural posture for fallen humanity. For sinners curved in upon themselves, thankfulness for love and grace is something that must be taught. We are those who hoard and clutch. Our confession of our shallow thankfulness highlights the need for us to learn thankfulness to God.

Thankfulness also points to what we are stewards of: love and grace! All the things we have traditionally called stewardship aren't actual stewardship. Rather, what matters is how we steward the one, true and only treasure: the love and grace of God revealed to us in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. So, all stewardship is stewardship

of the Gospel! How can we gaze at the cross and empty tomb and not be thankful?

The LCMS defines stewardship as "the free and joyous activity of God's family — the church — in managing life's resources for His purposes." God's love and mercy give us a clear purpose as we live out our Baptism and practice this joyous stewardship. All we are, all we have entrusted to us, and all we are called to do is to connect others with the love and mercy of God revealed in Jesus!


The faithful steward sings with lips and life of this love and mercy that is ever new and near. In the Scriptures. In the Lord's House. At the Lord's Table. This is where our stewardship song starts and ends. Our family, our co-workers and classmates, and our world need to hear this song!

"To be a Christian without prayer is no more possible than to be alive without breathing."

"But there are relics elsewhere in Christendom. Eighteen out of twelve apostles are buried in Spain."

"For a silver florin, I freed my grandfather from Purgatory. For twice that I could have sprung grandmother and uncle mothers too, but... I didn't have the funds, so they had to stay in the hot place. As for myself, the priests assured me that by gazing at sacred relics, I could cut down my time in purgatory. Luckily for me, Rome has enough nails from the holy cross to shoe every horse in Saxony."

"Temptations, of course, cannot be avoided, but because we cannot prevent the birds from flying over our heads, there is no need that we should let them nest in our hair."

"I simply taught, preached, wrote God's Word: otherwise I did nothing. And then when I slept or drank Wittenberg beer with my friend Philip of Amsdorf, the Word so greatly weakened the papacy that never a prince or emperor did such damage to it. I did nothing: the Word of God did it all."

"You are not only responsible for what you say, but also for what you do not say."

"Peace if possible, but the truth at any rate."

"To go against conscience is neither right nor safe. I cannot, and I will not recant. Here I stand. I can do no other. God help me."

This month we'll take a look back on the ministry of Westmaple Nursery School. In 1952, the first church-based preschool in Birmingham opened its doors. Myrtle Wuggazer and the congregation had a dream of providing Christian-based care for little ones. Redeemer, once again, stepped out in faith and preparations were made for 30 students. But God had other plans, and 72 children registered! Mrs. Wuggazer's vision for play-based learning and caring with dedicated teachers has flourished over the ensuing decades, and Westmaple is now a staple in Birmingham. Mrs. Wuggazer was the director of this amazing school for an incredible 41 years until her retirement in 1993.

Let's also look back on the Music Ministry of Redeemer from November 1925. One of the first things that happened at Redeemer in 1925 was the purchase of an organ and the formation of a choir. Music is very important to Lutheran worship, and we hold it dear to our hearts. Redeemer has had amazing organists, directors, soloists, singers, and musicians. The beauty of music ministry is that it includes everyone from toddlers to retirees. In the late 60's/early 70's, Redeemer's Thanksgiving service was broadcast each year on Channel 4. Every choir sang that day, and it was such a blessing to our community. Back in 1942, the red hymnal was instituted, and Pastor Ted demonstrated the use of it using phonograph records. We still use the red hymnal today as a testament to our history. The Women's Society in 1952 purchased 20 choir sets consisting of a gown, a stole, and a hat. What do you think ladies? Hats and maybe gloves in 2025?

WHAT BROUGHT YOU TO REDEEMER?



As members of the history committee, we often speak about how special Redeemer is to all of us and how blessed we are to have found our way here so many years ago. We wanted to share our stories with you, and hope that you will share your story with us, too!

In 1948, my grandparents (Walter and Esther Meinberg) and mom joined Redeemer. My grandfather was the church's lawyer, and my mom taught Sunday School. My parents (Don and Lucille Schoen) were married by Pastor Theodore in 1958, and I was baptized by Pastor Theodore in 1959. I attended Sunday School, VBS, School of Religion, and was confirmed by Pastor Duane. Vince Kochenderfer taught me the love of music, Mildred Reilly taught a class on how to be a teacher, and Bill Meinert was my role model. Because of his influence and God's direction, I attended Concordia, Ann Arbor and received my BA in Elementary Education, and taught at Holy Cross, Detroit, and Our Shepherd, Birmingham.

Being a part of the Youth Group and Camp (as a camper, counselor, and camp director) brought me life-long friends. I am so thankful that quite a few of us are still here at Redeemer. The faith that was nurtured at Camp and Youth Group will always be strong.

I was a part of the Children's Choir, Crusader Choir, Chancel Choir, Bell Choir, Wing and a Prayer Players, and played guitar on Sunday mornings at the 8:30 service. Eventually, I became the director of our Bell Choir and member of the Praise Team.

My parents passed away when they were quite young and having a home here at Redeemer made me feel more secure. I will always be thankful for the blessing of this church and its people and for my parents who led me here.

One of my most special memories is having my picture taken in the Bridal Lounge when Mick and I were married. I am in the same pose as my mom was on her wedding day.





COUNSELING CORNER

In September's Lamp article, I revealed that the people - my clients in my counseling practice - that get better and find relief in their difficult situations, are the ones that "do the work." Many of us in this self-contained culture tend to want an abbreviated method that works faster to get the job done quicker. NO CAN DO. In God's world, His timing - not ours! - is perfect. I've heard it said many times that God is never early but He's never late, either. We are not clairvoyant, and we cannot predict the future of how each optional scenario will end. Only God knows how each scenario will end and, because He is a loving and kind God who desperately loves us with everything He has, He picks the BEST scenario for us with the very BEST end result.

How many times have we all thanked God for not answering a particular prayer request? And in looking back, His answer was better and perfect! This is a hard pill to swallow because we all think we know what's best for us, "if dear Lord you just give me this or that or that person!" Again, remember, He knows how things will end so if you are patient with our dear Lord, He will manifest His best answer for you. Waiting on Him will develop perseverance and spiritual maturity (James 1).

This "waiting on God" exercise is actually doing the work. In not trying to jump ahead of Him and fix things your way, honoring His sovereignty by trusting and allowing Him to do the very best for you in HIS timing, a massive move forward in acquiring spiritual maturity occurs. It's not easy - I know! Sometimes, it's a daily sacrifice that we have to give God, our anxiety, fear, and sin.

May I encourage all of us to remember to confess our sins daily as "He is just and will forgive us" (John 1:9), as said in the Lord's Prayer - "forgive me my trespasses as I forgive those who trespass against me." You might take a look at and deeply contemplate in your prayer time each sentence of the Lord's Prayer, where you personally commune with the Father. He desires very much to be involved in all aspects of your life. Trusting Him in these things is also "doing the work."

Friends - this all takes intentional effort and a lot of discipline, but I promise you, it is well worth the effort!
